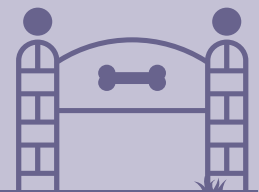
The \$5 million New Dog Parks Program is establishing 15 new off-leash dog parks in built-up urban areas across metropolitan Melbourne.
