Delivered annually since 2019, the *Volunteering Naturally* report is a collection of data about active environmental volunteer groups and organisations in Victoria.


We'd love to ensure your group is recognised for its contributions alongside other environmental volunteer groups and organisations.

The Good Neighbour Program is preparing for another year of submissions with applications closing at the end of June.

The program supports landholders and community groups in controlling the spread of invasive species on the public-private boundary. This is not a grants program, but funding is available for projects that are on the interface of DEECA or Parks Victoria managed land and private land.
