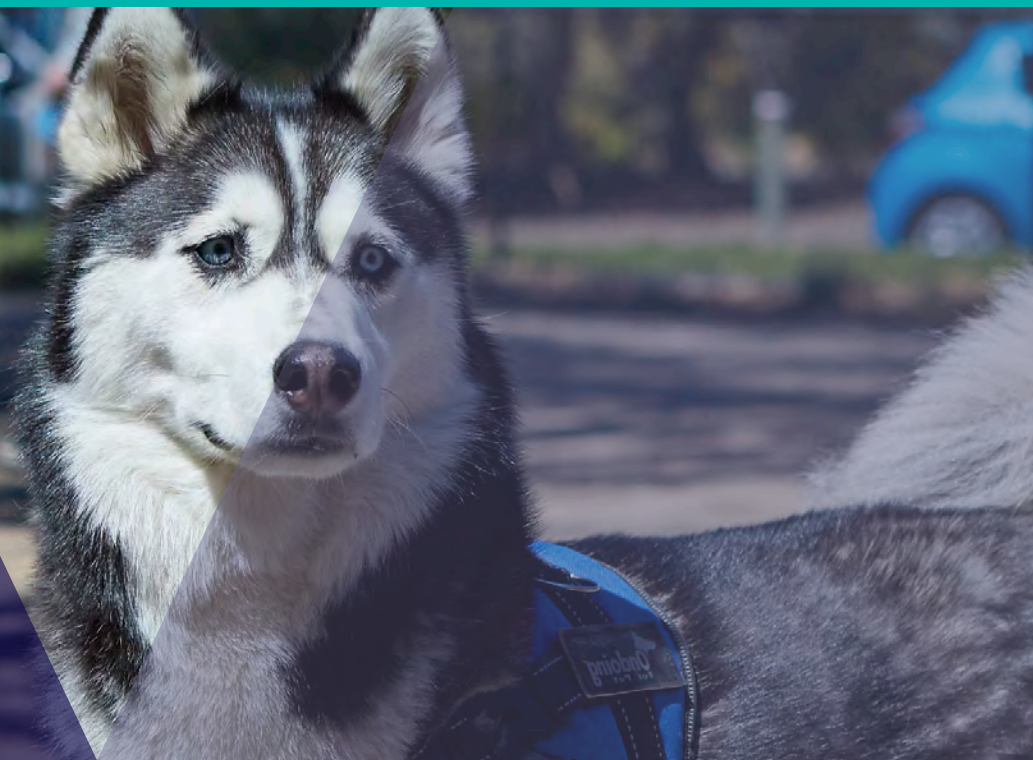


The Victorian Government is creating new dog parks across the state. This will give families more green, open space and create jobs as Victoria rebuilds from the economic impacts of coronavirus. The investment is part of the Government's Building Works package, providing \$2.7 billion towards projects big and small, to get thousands of people back to work.



New Dog Parks

The \$2.5 million Building Works investment is establishing 17 new off-leash dog parks in regional Victoria and metropolitan Melbourne.
