Summer by the Sea Grants - closes 15 October

Organisations can apply to share in \$70,000 of funding to deliver events that engage Victorians with their local coastlines.

The theme this year is "The Coast, the Sea, and our Community' reflecting the value and importance of community in how our beautiful local places are cared for.

Grants of up to \$7,000 are available for organisations to deliver Summer by the Sea events from 3 - 18 January 2026.

2025 Port Phillip Bay Fund - closes 12 November

The 2025 Port Phillip Bay Fund is now open with \$2.16 million available to support projects that strengthen the bay, ensuring its environment and coastal habitats remain healthy for the community.

There are two streams of grant funding available for 2025:

- up to \$200,000 for large-scale projects over two years
- up to \$20,000 for smaller projects over one year
