

E-Waste Submission

We write to confirm the position outlined by ALOA at the E-Waste Workshop held on October 12, 2015.

This included:

- 1. The e-waste ban to landfill needs to be clearly scoped to avoid confusion when the ban is put in place.
- 2. Scoping should clearly specify the type of waste to be included.
- 3. Banned e-waste should not include 'white goods' as these are currently well managed with refrigerator degassing and high metal recovery already in place.
- 4. ALOA supports recycling of all wastes and focuses on the disposal of residual wastes at its member sites.
- 5. E-waste as only 1% of the waste stream and consisting of mainly inert material does not create an environment risk to a BPEM compliant landfill.
- 6. ALOA members cannot be asked to take responsibility for e-waste contained in mixed loads of waste delivered for disposal.
- 7. It is unfair for ALOA members to be penalized because of system failures in the e-waste recycling 'chain'.
