Saving Native Species Program (Priority Species)

The Australian Government's Saving Native Species Program is providing \$224.5 million over four years to support the recovery of our unique plants, animals and ecological communities.

The program will run over four years from 2022-23 to 2025-26 and will boost outcomes for threatened native plants and animals. The objective of the grant program is to reduce the threat of extinction or increase the population of 110 priority species.

Our Marine Parks Grants - Round 4

Round four of the Australian Government's Our Marine Parks Grants is providing funding of \$8.6 million for projects between \$30,000 and \$500,000. Grants are available to support organisations to build their capacity and take an active role in the management of Australian marine parks, support evidence-based decision making, and improve ecosystem health.

This grant is open to a wide range of applicants including First Nations organisations, community groups and scientists.

A new Biosecurity Strategy is in development for Victoria. The strategy is building on Victoria's Biosecurity Statement endorsed by the Victorian Government in 2022. The purpose of the strategy is to turn the vision from the Biosecurity Statement into clear priorities.

To ensure this strategy is relevant to all Victorians, consultation is being run to gain insights from key groups and the public to strengthen the biosecurity system in Victoria.

The Victorian Landcare Program & Victorian Landcare Grants 2022 Achievements & Outcomes

Environmental volunteer and Landcare groups, networks and individuals supported by the Victorian Landcare Program achieved some incredible results in 2022. For example, 12,686 volunteers act for nature as part of the program, contributing a huge 288,986 volunteer hours with an economic value of \$12.06 million. The Victorian Government funds the Victorian Landcare Grants to support Landcare and environmental volunteering groups and networks for on-ground works, education and capacity building projects that protect and restore our land and natural environment.

The community delivers amazing results for the environment through the Victorian Landcare Grants. Outcomes achieved in 2022 include improvements to 45,000 hectares of land and 414 community events. The Victorian Landcare Program and Grants support <u>Biodiversity 2037</u>, the Victorian Government's long-term plan to protect Victoria's environment.
