Celebrating National Volunteer Week 2025 (19 - 25 May)

Thank you so much for all the work you do caring for our environment and supporting our local communities.

This year we created three videos to showcase how environmental volunteering helps to build relationships that enrich people's lives and strengthen communities. We have the Friends of Edwardes Lake and Action Sweetwater Creek preserving and nurturing the ecosystems of their local area and we also profiled the DEECA Helmeted Honeyeater Feeding Program which is an important element in the protection and recovery of this species in Yellingbo Reserve.

Indigenous Plant Nursery Map released

There are over 100 nurseries who supply indigenous Victorian Native plants for revegetation projects across the state.

The <u>Indigenous Plant Nurseries in Victoria Map</u> shows nurseries across Victoria that stock locally indigenous plants— including species that are native to specific areas and vital to the health of local ecosystems.

Whether you're a home gardener, an environmental volunteer, or simply interested in supporting biodiversity, this map will help you source the right plants for your region and contribute to caring for Country.
