Victorian Wildlife Rehabilitation Guidelines

Wildlife rehabilitation is undertaken by a diverse network of volunteer shelter operators and foster carers.

They do an incredible job providing appropriate care to sick, injured and orphaned native animals, with the goal of restoring them to their natural condition and releasing them back to the wild. They can also access veterinary assessment and treatment and nursing support where required.

The guidelines offer general information and also specific species related guidance for common Birds, Mammals, Reptiles and Amphibians.
