Celebrating Landcare Week 4 - 10 August 2025

It's Landcare Week and what better time to recognise the important role that Landcare and environmental volunteering groups play in protecting our environment.

This year's campaign theme - Landcare Is For Everyone (L.I.F.E.) - promotes the inclusivity and diversity of Landcare volunteers and their projects across Australia.

The annual event recognises thousands of people, groups and organisations for their contributions in caring for our soil, land, waterways, coasts, plants, animals and landscapes.

National Student Volunteer Week

National Student Volunteer Week also runs from 4 to 10 August. The week is a great opportunity to acknowledge the impact that students and young people make through volunteering.

Volunteering Victoria reports that more than 69% of young Victorians (15-24 years old) are volunteering - the highest rate of any age group.
